The agenda and discussion:

## 1. Conferences

- a. Association Supporting Computer Users in Education (ASCUE) Annual Conference, June 7 – 11, Myrtle Beach, SC – Kate's submission to present was accepted and she is confirmed to attend. Presentation will include an XSEDE Overview and Education Programs.
- b. PEARC20, July 25 – 30, Portland, OR
  - Space for the ACSC workshops is confirmed
  - ACSC Student Workshop – Deadline for applications extended until April 1. Same pattern as previous years, student wait for confirmation of their summer plans such as acceptance into internships and REU programs. Twelve application receive so far. One from CSULA and several from students attending ERN.
  - ACSC Curriculum Workshop – The interest is strong and invitations will go out to participants within the next week. Institutions participating include Albany State, Livingstone College, Spelman College, University of Maryland Eastern Shore and University of the Virgin Islands. Mentors confirmed.
  - Considering leveraging Sue Fratkin across both the student and faculty groups.
- c. Tapia
  - Exhibitor Registration – Linda registered XSEDE as an exhibitor and will pay the invoice when received using a credit card. Rosie and Valerie were included as information contacts for correspondence. Anticipate needing to develop a program book ad, submission of description, and other materials.
  - Workshop/Panel/BoF submission due Monday March 9. Should consider whether we should submit, encourage faculty to submit, and students to apply for travel scholarships (this depends on when Valerie's March Opportunity emails are sent.)
  - Change to include more job opportunities at our partner institutions. At June Quarterly will let everyone know what types of materials we'll be collecting for TAPIA. In July start requesting materials.
- d. SC20, November 14 – 20, Atlanta, GA
  - C4C Student Workshop – Applications will open mid-March
  - Faculty Event – Linda solicited input from faculty previously sponsored by CEE-BP to attend SC for ideas on what they'd like to see in a program targeted at Atlanta MSIs.
- e. Conference Tracking Updates – Grace Hopper has speaker, paper, and travel scholarship opportunities closing in March. No other for consideration until May.

## 2. Campus Visits

- a. CSU San Bernardino Campus Visit Debrief – Strong interest in Education Allocations; New User training with emphasis on example education uses scheduled for April 7; possible fall training in R and visualization for the fall.

- b. Albany State University Campus Visit Debrief – Partnership with the FGLSAMP (Florida and Georgia (really Albany State due to proximity to Tallahassee) modeled on CSULA NASA STEM DIRECT Partnership. FAMU is the lead, ASU would lead the data science partnership with XSEDE. 13 institutions involved including Bethune Cookman, FAMU, FIU, Florida State, University of Central Florida, University of Miami, University of South Florida, community colleges. Has potential to reach a large number of students. Met with several faculty interested in using XSEDE for research and submitting to EMPOWER; met with students and encouraged application to ACSC/C4C, EMPOWER, IU and TACC REUs; met with Provost who confirmed support for participation in ACSC curriculum workshop at PEARC20 and also suggested the them for C4C in Atlanta (cannot disclose here since this is public information and them is not revealed until the first day of the workshop); connected them with Dana so they can add one or two more campus champions.
  - c. University of Maryland Eastern Shore to be scheduled in late March or early April
  - d. Tuskegee University to be scheduled and an institution to consider for SC20 Atlanta Inclusivity activities
  - e. Livingstone College (NC) to be scheduled with Kate for support in expanding data science curriculum
3. Workshops
- a. CSULA NASA Direct STEM – 2/22, 3/7, 3/21, and 3/28 – all things progressing; New User Training went well and high number of successful accesses to Stampede; walk through of Intro to Linux/Unix scheduled for this afternoon.
  - b. AUCC Data Science Initiative – Linda will check in with Bettina to see if any additional information from the faculty committee is available and will suggest small group consultation with Kate to assist with identify specific resources, data sets, and problems for the general education data science course being developed. Small groups may be the way to address the dichotomy in experience between the different departments.
